

RURAL RELOCATION BENEFIT

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

You are eligible if you:

(a) Reside in a county with less than 7 persons per square mile;

and

(b) Either -

- (1) Physically relocate at least 500 miles in order to pursue a program of education under the Post-9/11 GI Bill; **or**
- (2) Travel by air to physically attend an institution of higher learning for pursuit of a program of education under the Post-9/11 GI Bill if no other land-based method of transportation is available due to an absence of roads or other infrastructure.

HOW MUCH DOES THE RURAL RELOCATION BENEFIT PAY?

If you qualify for the benefit, you will receive a one-time payment of \$500.00.

HOW DO I APPLY?

You must complete the form on the other side of this page and mail it, along with the following documentation, to the VA Regional Processing Office that handles your education claim.

(1) PROOF OF RURAL RESIDENCE - You must provide proof of rural residency by submitting any of the following documents with your name and current address:

- DD 214, Certification of Release or Discharge from Active Duty; **or**
- The most recent Federal income tax return; **or**
- The most recent State income tax return; **or**
- Rental/lease agreement; **or**
- Mortgage document; **or**
- Current real property assessment; **or**
- Voter registration card.

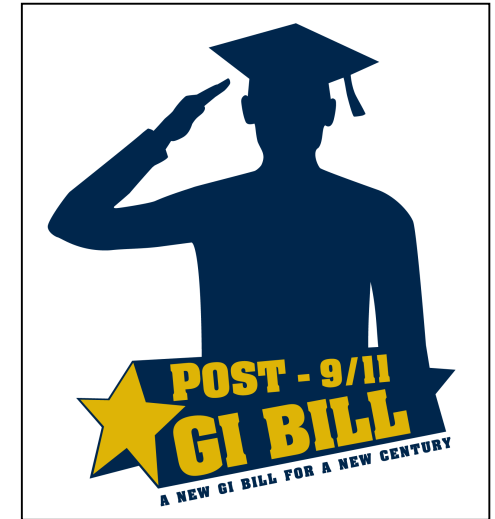
(2) PROOF OF AIR TRAVEL - If you are traveling by air you must provide proof of travel by submitting an airline receipt for travel with a departure and destination airport within reasonable distance from the home of residence and the institution of higher learning you plan to attend.

PROOF OF RURAL RESIDENCE

You must provide proof of residence in a rural relocation by submitting any of the following documents bearing your name and address:

- DD 214, Certification of Release or Discharge from Active Duty; or The most recent Federal income tax return; or The most recent State income tax return; or Rental/lease agreement; or Mortgage document; or Current real property assessment

PROOF OF AIR TRAVEL

If you traveled by air, you must provide an airline receipt for travel with a departure and destination airport within reasonable distance from your rural home of residence and the institution of higher learning where you are enrolled.
